## UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: The Star-Spangled Banner

This song was made the official anthem of the United States by a Bill which passed the Senate on 3 March 1931. Before then, no official anthem existed, although for a long time this song had been the official anthem of the US Army and Navy. The words date from 1814 and were set to the melody of *Anacreon in Heaven*, a song composed in the early 1780s by the young English composer John Stafford Smith, who later became well known as a conductor, singer, organist and composer. The song was specially written for an exclusive society founded in London in 1771, The Anacreontic Society. (Incidentally, the Anacreontic Society was a popular gentlemen's club of amateur musicians, named in honour of Anacreon, a sixth century B.C. Greek lyric poet.) The opening measures of the melody were used by Puccini in his opera *Madama Butterfly*, first produced in Milan in 1904.

A *ritenuto* is often placed in measure 19 and the last four measures of the anthem are often played at a broader pace. In symphonic band use, trumpets and trombones may be omitted in the *piano* section between the last beat of measure 17 and the *anacrusis* before measure 26 if the woodwind section is large enough.
